

Case study

GEORGIAN-INSPIRED COUNTRY HOUSE



Located on the outskirts of a small Berkshire village near the River Thames, this new build property was constructed to replace a tired mid-1980's property. This new property follows a more traditional 'Georgian-inspired' style which sits more comfortably with the surrounding properties.

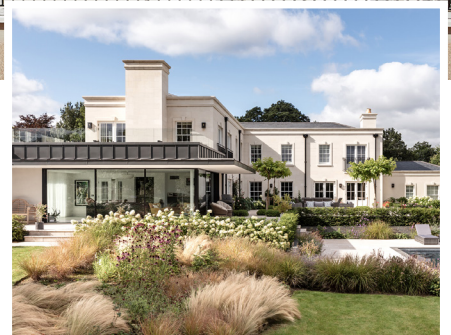
Following a thorough planning process a restricted palette of high quality materials were agreed. We were contracted to supply and fit the stonework.

All main façades have coursed ashlar walls and pronounced window surrounds with keystones. A feature circular window sits at the front of the property above a two column entrance portico.

The parapet walls and two chimneys have a moulded string, with a moulded, once weathered, coping.
